(The front door of this house was formerly the entrance to Princeton's first church. There are five fireplaces, one nine feet long. To bring in the "Forelog" (firelog?) required a yoke of oxen on one side of the house, with chain attached and running through to log on other side, when temp was - 20. The walls of the upper rooms were decorated by Nathan Merriam when he was through for the day, his wife holding a candle for him to see by, as he painted.)
